

Respect Life




As the divide between pro-life and pro-abortion people widens, the Knights of Columbus are expanding their efforts to save babies. The Knights donated their 1,500th ultrasound to a New Jersey pregnancy center. Florida pregnancy resource centers (PRCs) have received over 100 of these life-saving machines. The impact of this generosity is felt across the nation, like the ripples of a wave. When a PRC in Port Charlotte benefited from their charity, an older ultrasound was shipped to a PRC in Oklahoma.

The latest Knights initiative is the ASAP (Aid and Support After Pregnancy) program. When a local council donates \$500 to a PRC, the Supreme Council will add an extra \$100 to that donation. Supreme will do that up to \$2,000. Hey Catholic men, come and join your local council!

Babies aborted this week: Chloe, Poppy, Samuel, Lydia, and Blake. Charlotte County residents, even without the Olean Avenue abortion clinic, still have over 250 abortions each year. Please keep praying.



CHURCH ETIQUETTE

- ATTIRE The idea of Sunday best should be honored; churchgoers of all ages should dress conservatively. Coat and tie is appropriate for difficulty sitting quietly distracting, take them on the second settle down. They may
- ARRIVAL Offering envelopes should be prepared ahead of time. Arrive at least 10 minutes before Mass begins. This helps reduce distractions and provides time to get settled. Latecomers should wait to be seated by ushers so as not to disrupt the Mass and the congregation. Please avoid chewing gum or eating candy when coming to Mass.

men, but not required. Women should wear modest dresses, skirts and slacks; no tank tops,

short skirts or tight-fitting clothing.

- enter the Church, please refrain from over socializing with others. Remember that others are already engaged in prayer in their seats. It is optional to bless yourself with holy water, but as a sign of respect for the Blessed Sacrament, genuflect (bow if you are unable to genuflect) before taking your seat. Move to the center of the pew to accommodate others who arrive after you.
- QUIET TIME Turn off cell phones and pagers. It is understandable that children may have

- difficulty sitting quietly, but when they become distracting, take them out briefly until they settle down. They may simply need a change of environment. The Narthex is an appropriate place to take them.
- SIGN OF PEACE People usually shake hands or exchange a quick kiss, but if you have a cold or cough, you can politely say, "Peace be with you," without shaking hands.
- CONSECRATION Elevation of the Host and Chalice after the words of consecration are spoken is a sacred time, and there should be silent reverence with no movement around the church, except in an emergency.
- COMMUNION Again, please refrain from socializing when leaving the pew to receive Communion. Receive the holy Eucharist with reverence, bow slightly and respond "Amen."
- Mass is singing a closing hymn. Leaving before the hymn ends is inappropriate. Genuflect (or bow) toward the altar before leaving. Refrain from greeting and visiting each other until leaving the church. Have respect for those who wish to remain in prayer.

BAPTISM

Baptisms are celebrated on the last Saturday of the month. Parents should contact our Office of Faith Formation at (941) 585-0668 or faithformation@stcbc.org at least six weeks before the anticipated Baptism to register for the preparation class.

THE RITE OF ANOINTING

A person does not need to wait until the point of death to receive this sacrament. For those who are about to depart from this life, the Church offers the person Penance, Anointing of the Sick, and the Eucharist as Viaticum (food for the journey) given at the end of life. Contact the Parish Office at (941) 625-4754 to schedule an anointing.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

If you are a registered parishioner of St. Charles Borromeo Church and plan to marry in our parish, please contact the Office of Faith Formation at (941) 585-0668 at least six months prior to the tentative wedding date.

CONVALIDATION OF MARRIAGES

Were you married outside of the Catholic Church? Don't hesitate to contact the Office of Faith Formation at (941) 585-0668 or faithformation@stcbc.org to make arrangements to have your marriage blessed by one of our priests.

DIVORCED OR SEPARATED

Don't let a separation or a legal divorce keep you from the life of the

ANNULMENT






Legion of Mary


